

For over 150 years the German immigrant community that gave rise to St. Luke's diversity today, has been at the

heart of New Rochelle in service, care for the poor and the hurting, the hungry and those in need, which includes all of us.

Through ministries of Christian education, stewardship, evangelism, social ministry, worship, music, service and fellowship we have ministered together.

Through three church buildings we as a people have shepherded together, worshipped together, ministered, consoled and comforted one another and sang God's praises and received God's grace through Water, Word and Holy Communion.

Our celebration will include Mass/Worship at 10:00 AM on <u>October 6</u> with special music and invited guests, including our new bishop, Bishop Paul Egensteiner, presiding.

A light reception will follow. Then from 12 noon to 4 p.m. there is a Gala Luncheon at Sergio's Ristorante in Pelham, NY. The purchase of reservations at \$60 for a four-course meal is required by September 1, so please respond now as seating is limited for this once in a lifetime event!

Historical pictures, memorabilia and other archives will be displayed in a special glass case in the church narthex.

Our desire is to glorify God in Jesus Christ in this celebration. It is your celebration and all of ours because the ministry is yours too. Our ministry together continues to change hearts and lives.

Our worship that day will be enriched by your participation since you are part of God's ministry. We enjoy and pass on what has been given to us by others in the ministry of 150 years in this community. If you live at a distance or haven't been around in a while, it doesn't matter. This is your church and we want to see you again! If you are newly arrived in the Jesus community of St. Luke's –this is your church and we are looking for you, in welcome!

DID YOU KNOW?

INTERESTING MEMORIES OF ST. LUKE'S 150 YEARS

[Cathie Behrend continues to share some memories of St. Luke's history during our 150th Anniversary year. Look for "Did You Know?" each month! This month we are "catching up" with three missed during the summer.]

When I was in Confirmation class one Wednesday afternoon (we got time off from school like the Catholic kids), Pastor Heck took us down to the train station –a short walk down the hill ---because General Dwight Eisenhower was coming through New Rochelle. Presidential candidates still crossed the country on trains and spoke off the last car at towns along the way in those days. What a thrill to see in person the man who would later be elected President of the United States,

Our old stone church had been on Division Street for many years when it was decided to run the New England Thruway through New Rochelle. We would lose our building and have to relocate. We finally found property on Eastchester Road. The old building would have to come down before the new one would be finished, so we needed a place to worship in the meantime. North Avenue Presbyterian Church offered us the run of their Parish Hall (where the Police Station is now) for the time we would be homeless. This worked out very well and we were quite appreciative!

While the new church was being built, we used the old house at 95 Eastchester Road address (now our parking lot) for organizational meetings, choir practice, and even the annual bazaar in November. It was a little crowded, but we survived. In the old church we always had a ham dinner after the bazaar---white linen tablecloths, holly decorations, and a sprinkling of poppy seeds from the rolls. The older German ladies would cook up a storm in the kitchen, and fragments of conversation in German and clouds of steam and heat would pour out into the hall. I couldn't wait for dad to come in on the train from NYC so we could eat!

The ice cream social was perfectly timed for the heatwave and refreshing after the Christmas in July worship service.





Our book club will meet on Wednesday, September 18, at 7:30 P.M. in St. Luke's kitchen.


