
Holy Communion: 10:00 A.M. Sunday School— June 10:00 A.M. Fellowship: 11:15 A.M Throughout 2017 we have had a worldwide celebration of the impact of the Reformation and Martin Luther. Now in the month of October the intensity of celebration comes

to a head on Sunday, October 29, as we approach the 500th Anniversary of Martin Luther initiating that Reformation by nailing the 95 Thesis to the Wittenberg church doors on October 31, 1517.

What is it we are celebrating?

Not too long ago, Reformation Sunday for Lutherans was the most important festival between Easter and Christmas. We celebrate that the gospel sets us free.

Without question, it is God's grace---not our ancestry, bloodline or good works---that brings us to eternal life This radical good news through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is never a good thing to those who wish to control our lives. As long as sin remains in the world, we will face challenges to that word of grace and freedom.



The Good News comes from outside ourselves and reaches into the heart.

A few weeks ago, one of our parents told me that they were watching the network news when a segment came up about Hurricane Harvey hitting Texas with devastation. Initially televangelist Joel Osteen had refused to open the doors of his Houston megachurch to the scores of people that needed safety and help.

Three of their children were in the room and heard this.

One of the children said, "That's wrong! How can a church not help people?" Then another chimed in, "Pastor Bill would come and save us. He'd find us and bring us to the church!"

Yes, to hear such trust is humbling. But it also reminds us that the saving word needs to come from outside ourselves.

We are saved by God's grace through Jesus Christ who has come to save us. He goes in search of everyone, especially the lost and brings us into the community we call the church.

By scripture alone. By faith alone. By grace alone. Through these gifts external to us, God calls us by name and adopts us as his children once and for all. Nothing can take that from us.

We celebrate 500 years of continued Reformation. The external and saving Lord reaches into the world with two arms of love, the same arms that bore the cross for you and me.

Even when we are hard on ourselves, or lack self-esteem, the gospel declares that we are forgiven and treasured in God's sight.

We are set free by the Spirit who continues to lead us to surprising places as God's grace is announced in new ways in our time!

October 31, 2017 marks 500 years since the beginning of the Lutheran Reformation, spurred by Martin Luther's posting of the 95 Theses. 


