

It's hard to believe that our 150th year long Church Anniversary celebration culminates in October.

We have celebrated, rejoiced over God's gifts through many people now and long ago and we are ready for the future – what God calls us to next.

"Midway this way of life we're bound upon, I woke to find myself in a dark wood", writes Dante in the opening to "The Divine Comedy".

In a way this year has been a midlife inventory of who we have been and who we are. To discover the past is also to make an inventory of our best and worst moments. While we looked through that history, we discovered brave and faithful forebears. We also discovered disunity several times in that history. Somehow, by God's grace, we went on.

We are thankful for the diversity of our congregation. In the historical record we also discovered an ignorance about race in that history – a minstrel show that was a mark of ignorance with no ill will in those days, endemic to much of society then. The unintentional racism is the hardest to see. Somehow by God's grace, we grew up.

So, our dark side has things to teach us as we contemplate the future. The only way up is down. The only way to make course corrections is to see where we do not want to be.

This is true for the individual and our community. 12 step programs remind us – we needed to make a searching moral inventory in order to be set free.

The hymn "We Are Called" reminds us "to be hope for the hopeless so hatred and blindness will be no more... We are called to act with justice, we are called to love tenderly; we are called to serve one another, to walk humbly with God." That is true freedom.

The first day of November is All Saints Day – right after October 31, Halloween, which means "the holy evening" before All Saints Day. On that day we remember the very "saints and sinners" that we each and all are, saved only by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We will remember those who have died and especially those who passed away this year. I think especially of Tom Roksvold and many others whom we miss and still think of daily. (Mention of Tom's passing in August was not in the September news-letter because it is put together in July.)

None were perfect, just like us. None are always wise, just like us. They and our forebears are remarkably alike in our being conditioned by our own times; often blind, sometimes noble. The one thing that holds us all together is Christ Himself and Jesus' call to be understanding, compassionate and in all things to be forgiving and forgiven. In the radical nature of divine love, we become less the children of darkness and more the children of light.

The future is exciting! God has a great dream for St. Luke's. Southern Westchester is growing. New Rochelle is building. Our community is growing. We are part of God's adventure. Only one thing is necessary. It got us across 150 years. It will carry us into the future:

"Be Thou my vision, O Lord."

We've celebrated the past. Now let's look to the future!

INTERESTING MEMORIES OF ST. LUKE'S 150 YEARS

The Sunday School picnic was always held at the Wartburg grounds, until the gas crisis in the 1970's decided us to use our own picnic grove which turned out well. There is nothing like the taste of a Tootsie Roll that has been ground into the earth by a stampede of children anxious to collect the most candy.

Luther League in the 1920's and 1930's was much more a social event –concerts, plays, parties—with an older crowd of young people. Today's Youth Group is still social but also serves and helps the church in many ways.

The old church had many women's organizations – social, philanthropic, and service oriented. They made quilts, sewed cancer pads, etc. Nowadays many more women are in the working world and so these organizations have disappeared.


BOOK CLUB CORNER



St. Luke's Book Club met on September 18, to discuss *Pachinko*, a novel by Korean-American author, Min Jin Lee. We discussed Lee's sweeping four generation saga of a Korean family as they struggled to survive in Japan.We talked about an immigrant family trying to establish their own way of belonging while living in a largely hostile land. We used the novel's opening sentence, " History has failed us, but no matter. " as our point of departure. We considered the themes of belonging and self-identity vs. national identity. Lee's many subjects include history, war, economics, class, gender and religion. Lee's themes deal with forgiveness, loss, desire, aspiration, failure,

duty and faith. *Pachinko* is about outsiders, minorities and the politically disenfranchised.

Our October book is *Winter Garden* by Kristin Hannah. We will meet on Wednesday, October 23, at 7:30 P.M. in St. Luke's kitchen. All are welcome to join us.

Just a reminder: if your child has not already been registered, and therefore would not be on our class list, please send me an email with their Name, address, telephone number, parent names and grade, date of birth. Children 3 years old and older are welcome. Children 2 ½ -3, potty trained and ready to attend an hour of Sunday school each week are also welcome. We have amazing teachers ready to share the good news with your children. Please take some time to speak to your teachers, meet your child's classmates and make some new friends.

Sunday school is every Sunday from 10-11:15 except for school holidays. Children worship with their own liturgy service and then attend age appropriate classes. They have their own lessons and receive their own stewardship envelopes for weekly contributions. The Sunday School is self-supporting through their own contributions. 
