

An Attitude of Gratitude



When was the last time you said, "thank you"?

I'm sure for us it's a long-standing practice to be polite – say thank you to the person who bags your groceries. Say thank you to a co-worker or employee. Teaching your children to always say "please" and

"thank you'. We all share that touch of simple civility and politeness.



But when was the last time you said "thank you" to whom a thank you was long overdue?

One of the surprises at our Gratitude Brunch on Reformation Sunday was a moment after Henry and Rosemarie Doerr received "Distinguished Disciple awards along with Cathie Behrend. When it was Henry's turn to thank everyone, he also turned to our sexton, Ed Moreno and family and said, "You know Eduardo, with all the years of my being on the property committee, we could never have done it all without you. I never said thank you." He paused, looked Ed straight in the eye and said, "thank you".

There wasn't a dry eye in the house.

When Eduardo and Silvia and family received an award for over 33 years as Sexton, Ed could only say after a long-standing ovation, "Thank you. Thank you".

The best speech I ever heard.

To whom do we owe a long overdue 'thank you", in this November month of Thanksgiving? Who do you need to thank by stopping everything in your life for a moment, look them in the eye and speak your heart?

There is the story in Luke 17:11-19 of the ten lepers who were healed by Jesus. They went to show themselves to the priests, but one Samaritan leper turned back to thank Jesus for what he had done to change that man's life. This one Samaritan leper embodies gratitude with God in mind. He stops moving on to the "next thing", aware and attentive to what all this means to him.

He turns back, with praise on his lips and gratitude in his heart.

Life brings its trials for sure, but grace abounds. It would be a shame to miss these miracle moments we can have with a real, from the heart, "thank you".

When we give thanks to God, we see the world more clearly, grace upon grace. We come to worship on Sunday above all to give thanks to God in this community offering praise and thanksgiving. When we praise Him then our hearts are lifted, as well as His. We find the truly holy present in the moment of gratitude and praise among others.

This is an important thing for a person to do.

Stop and think of Him and those also who are long overdue for thanks.

STEWARDSHIP



HOPE COMMUNITY SERVICES NEWS

This Fall is a busy season for Hope Community Services and St. Luke's. With Walter Ritz in the helm as the new executive director Hope seeks more help from his church and synagogue partners to fill the shortfall from the traditional donors for its programs and its new mission for the Homeless Shower Trucks.



This year one of Hope's turkey donors cut back by 100 birds so St Luke's will start its Buy a Bird promotion early to help. For every \$15 coupon purchased by Nov. 18 Hope can buy a turkey for its Thanksgiving give-away. Please be generous, Hope expects to give away a total of 700 turkeys. Also needed are items that Hope is unable to source through the Food Bank like cranberry sauce, and stuffing mix. Look for the food pantry box in the Narthex to add these items by Nov. 18.

Carole Traub, who has successfully expanded Hope Community Services from its Soup Kitchen origins is now the director of development and is a valuable resource to Walter in this transition. In the long term Walter hopes to improve the programming for the Homeless Resource Center adding activities throughout the day, redo the dining room floor and improve the dining area.

Hope's short term goals are focused on a coat drive, the Thanksgiving turkey collection, and supporting the new shower trucks. These trucks containing two showers and

funded by a churches in White Plains. Shiloh Baptist and Hope are working together to bring the trucks to other parts of Westchester. They offer homeless people a shower, clean clothing, and haircuts. The program began in September and is expected to continue through the winter months. Walter is hoping to coordinate flu shots and other services with the shower truck visits.


ADVENT VESPERS/ EVENING PRAYER - BEGINS DECEMBER 4

We explored the complicated and strained relationship between two sisters and their mother. We talked about the themes of female strength and solidarity during hard times.
