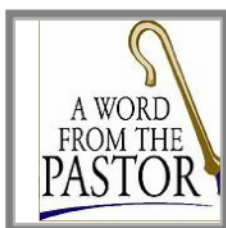

## Sacred Space



One of the challenges of envisioning a new life is imagining what needs to be pared down now for a new tomorrow.

This is not theoretical.

One night I sat in the parsonage living room imagining all the furniture gone as it will be when we move. As empty as the day we moved in 33 years ago --- which seems now like in the blink of an eye. The books removed. The television and stereo packed away. The DVD's and CDs gone.

Just bare white walls. And a mirror over the fireplace.

With everything gone in my mind's eye, the living room felt smaller, not larger. With the familiar furnishings that distract the eye and lend comfort to a feeling of "my home," the room now felt simple, waiting, expectant.

This exercise is a reminder of the temporary nature of things, whether five years, 33 years or 90 in a lifetime. "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return," we say on Ash Wednesday as a reminder of our mortality and a time to pare down to what is essential in our relationship with the eternal God we meet in Jesus Christ.

The practices of Lent are meant for us to see this, and seeing it, begin a new adventure in living. "Giving up something for Lent" is taking the furniture out of our inner room so that we are less distracted by the inconsequential and make more room for being with God and our true selves for forty days of Lent. The tools of Lent -- prayer, fasting from whatever we need to step back from, and doing deeds of kindness ("almsgiving" Jesus calls it.) all are means of moving out the secondary things that fill our days and making room for God.

It's also making room for the real you. A place for your soul to come out.

Try it yourself in the room where you are sitting. Imagine all the objects gone. Now, quietly, what is important to you?

Where is your "sacred space"? The place where you go to be yourself with God? It can be anywhere -- by the ocean, in the woods, in your car ("chapel on wheels") singing your heart out. It can be in the rituals that lead expectantly to your sacred place, beneath a stained-glass window or up at sunrise, the sun glowing upon you or the stars at night. It might be from your bed or a favorite chair. It is the space you can best be with God. Beneath a stained-glass window or noticing the flora in a tidal pool or the vastness of the sky; the greatness of it and the smallness of you. God's love is so large.

Enter your empty room this Lent. Take out the distractions. Make room to be with yourself and God in Christ.

Blessings on the way to resurrection!

Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High  
will rest in the shadow of the Almighty.

I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my fortress,  
my God, in whom I trust." ((Psalm 91:1-2)

### EVENING PRAYER IN LENT –

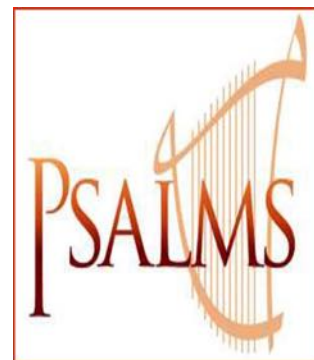

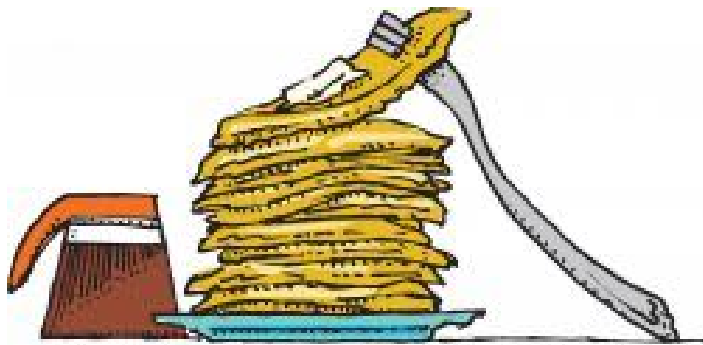

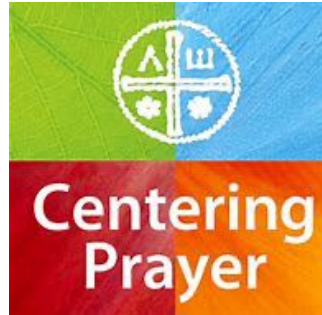
*Celebrate Shrove Tuesday, or Mardi Gras (French for Fat Tuesday), on the day before Ash Wednesday. "Shrove" of Shrove Tuesday is an old English way of saying Confession and Absolution. This is the most important feature of the Holiday. We confess our sins on Shrove Tuesday as a way of getting ready for Lent. Another way we celebrate is to prepare for the Lenten fast. Fasting helps us to remember that we are dust and to dust we shall return, and also that man may not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God. In centuries past the Lenten fast included abstaining from any rich or fatty foods... hence the name "Fat Tuesday". This is why we celebrate with our pancake supper!*

## WHAT DOES "A RECORD OF CONTRIBUTION" MEAN?

The term *contribution of record* means that at least one contribution of any amount by a person has been identified and has been recorded by the Financial Secretary to that person's envelope number or name. It is so important, when using an envelope especially, that you put your first and last name on the envelope. Cash donations definitely need your whole name to be donations of record.

This is one of two minimum requirements in order to be kept as an active member of St. Luke's. The other requirement is to receive Holy Communion at least once a year.

## UPDATE FROM OUR SOCIAL MINISTRY COMMITTEE

After moving into their Queens apartment in late January Navid, an Afghan refugee, sent a wish list of items his family still needed to Hearts and Homes for Refugees. Melissa Roddy, household coordinator for the nonprofit group, shared the list with St. Luke's to see if we could source more items. Our thanks to those who sent Navid's family a wall clock, shopping cart, toaster and a sewing machine.

Susanne Kuligowski was able to source two sewing machines by reaching out through social media. The first was delivered to Navid by Melissa Roddy and the second was checked out by Martha and Peter Johnson to make sure it worked. Thankfully the Johnsons solved the problem and found that the battery needed charging. This machine will go to the next Afghan family to arrive, along with linens, towels, kitchen goods and baby items previously donated by St. Luke's.



Our thanks to everyone who contributed their time, in kind donations and cash. St. Luke's received a total of \$850 in monetary donations that purchased new items including mattresses, an iron, and a highchair. It also paid for the two-day rental of a truck, and two young men from Task Rabbit who unloaded the truck and moved in the furniture.

There are several more Afghan families expected to arrive this summer including a family of eight. Please contact Elizabeth Brent if you wish to learn more about how you can help or if you wish to join the Social Ministry committee.

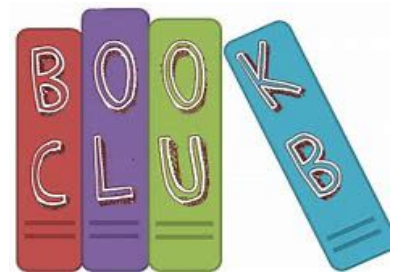
