

On the Threshold of a New Life



You are on the threshold of a new life. So am I So are we all.

A curious observation: people tend to stop in the doorways to a room, neither in nor out but both. At a party it would seem the one place people would want to leave free for entrance and exit. But instead, like people gathering around an indoor fountain, people tend to gather in the threshold, the place of transitions.

As I ready for retirement, I feel in-between being pastor of St. Luke's and a new life in retirement---on the threshold of both.

The funny thing about thresholds is they allow us to look back as well as ahead. Instead of seeing your life as either being in one place or the other, one life or the other, our lives are a continuum of choices and memories; a continuum of transformations that beckon us.



We are on a threshold of life and death, job and vocation,

youth age and older age. Everyone is getting older. Everyone is transforming as we speak. We are always both arriving and departing. Ecclesiastes reminds us that to everything there is a season. The thing about seasons is that they return repeatedly in the cycle of nature. Entrance and exit. Exit and entrance. Ebb and flow. Hovering in the doorways.

God told the Israelites to mark their doorways in Egypt. God was about to change their lives. A bridegroom may customarily carry his bride over the threshold as a sign they are beginning their new life together.

We are on a threshold every day of our lives. Even love is transformed daily if we pay attention to it. A living thing.

Author and retreat leader Joyce Rupp says of all this that "The power of a threshold resounds in the story of the resurrection. From the hollow deadness of the tomb, Christ came forth transformed with unmistakable splendor. So in our threshold experiences. The Holy one's life-giving energy frees and gifts us with what enables us to express the beauty of our soul."

The power of the Resurrection is hope. The power of the Resurrection is to see with the eyes of faith that we stand at the door of a new life constantly. It is, as an adventurous well-traveled friend of mine said recently, "scary, anxious...and exciting!"

My most meaningful moments of ministry have been being a companion in your thresholds, the transitions of sorrows and joys. Times of genuine vulnerability, authenticity, and truth -when life breaks the skin and sometimes the heart.

In a way, there is no leaving without an arriving of some kind in our lives. It is a divine sign that God is with us, inviting us to new worlds, ultimately into that which is both simultaneously death and Life, a going and a coming. It's no accident that a symbol of resurrection is a caterpillar transforming into a butterfly, beginning the moment it enters this world.

Look at the thresholds of your life. They are the places where God is near.

"The LORD shall preserve your going out and your coming in from this time forth, and for evermore." (Psalm 121:8)


