Even if things seem changed, we can notice that there are still many things that are comfortingly the same.

As an interim pastor, I also encourage us all to pay close attention to what exactly claims our attention. Do we find ourselves feeling a bit brittle, or giddy, or just exhausted? Are small things more upsetting, or daily things overwhelming?

In a transition time, and particularly in this phase of the pandemic, we have every right to feel worn out. Our bodies and minds and spirits have experienced a long stretch of anxious time. It is OK to not be OK.

I invite you to consider what few things are the most important in your life. Consider paring down and even slowing down this fall. As we come into the stewardship season, we are all of us invited to reflect on our gratitude to God for what we have been through, and what is ahead. Our gratitude for health, our families, our very lives.

And of course, gratitude for St. Luke's! Gratitude for our presence in the community, for all of the ways we reach out, share grace and hope, and encourage both parishioners and strangers. Our church is a beacon of light in New Rochelle, and we are the lighthouse keepers who keep the flame alive.

Together, let's focus on what is right in front of us- caring for one another, for our buildings, and for all of the ways we are asked to show up in this Transition. We may not be able to see the details of the future, but we CAN believe and trust in the guidance of the Spirit who will lead us there.


