REPORT FROM TH CHURCH COUNCIL

Welcome February... one month less of winter! But the start of the Lenten Season! Happy Valentines Day. Hope to see you all Shrove Tues, Feb 13th, and Ash Wed. Feb 14th!

I am submitting this report as part of the newsletter as acting Council President for the end of 2023.

There will be more details included in my annual report letter, but I want to thank you all for your patience, dedication and commitment to our council and our church during this difficult transitional period.



Thank you to the council who have been working tirelessly in helping to preserve our church and its future. Thank you, Denise Tolles, our Vice President, Brett Buehrer, Traci Daniele, our Financial Secretary, Steve Olsen, our Treasurer, Ed O'Garro, Julia Ungewitter and Walter Glatz.

Since our last newsletter (prepared in November) we have been very busy.

We sent an email to the entire congregation detailing the situation with the Church and the Synod. Bottom line is they gave us 3 options. Business as Usual, Holy Closure or Synodical Administration.

We have sent a survey to all members of the congregation; we received 52 responses. We specifically asked you what you wanted. All but 4 voted for Business as Usual and they would wait and see if we would be allowed to sell the parsonage to make well needed repairs on the church building and bring St. Luke's into the future.

On January 27th the Synod Council met. We requested permission from them (as required by ELCA Constitution) to move ahead with selling of our Parsonage. Just today they sent us an email that we may proceed! Of course, we first need approval from the majority of our congregation at our annual meeting on Sunday, February 11th. Please be present!

On Saturday January 20th our Sexton, Sylvia, of more than 30 years advised us she would be retiring at the end of May 2024. Decisions will have to be made as to that position going forward.

The prior Property Chairs have also resigned in the last months of the prior year. Leam McEvoy has graciously stepped up into that role. He has been very busy between the parsonage being vacated and severe weather causing havoc on our doors. Luckily, he works nearby and is able to come by during his lunch break and after work to address any issues.

Currently we have Pastors confirmed for at least two services a month, through May, and four services in March. This includes Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. We have been extremely fortunate to have such wonderful and dedicated Deacons and Lay Leader to help us continue to have weekly worship services. Thank you, Nancy Sigler, Renee Taylor and Susanne Kuligowski for your commitment.

Fasting helps us to remember that we are dust and to dust we shall return, and also that man may not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God. In centuries past the Lenten fast included abstaining from any rich or fatty foods... hence the name "Fat Tuesday". This is why we celebrate with our pancake supper!




