## And Who Is My Neighbor?

25 Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. 'Teacher,' he said, 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?' <sup>26</sup> Jesus said to him, 'What is written in the law? What do you read there?' <sup>27</sup>He answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself.' <sup>28</sup>And he said to him, 'You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live.'

29 But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbor?' (Luke chapter ten)

This exchange with Jesus and the lawyer is one of my very favorite portions of my favorite Gospel. Among other things is the question the lawyer asks as a follow up: 'And who is my neighbor?' Like many of the most important questions in life there is not a simple, direct answer. It is a question we must ask each day and a question every church must deliberate on.

Many American Lutheran churches were born out of mass migrations. Norwegians, Slovaks, Finns, and Estonians and others were a part of 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century waves of immigrants. They started churches which grew rapidly with a flood of people who urgently needed to connect in a strange new land. The Immigration and Nationality Act of 1965 changed all that; waves of Europeans became a global influx. The mid-1960s was the highest rate of church attendance in American history, churches doubled in size in a matter of ten years. Immigration was only a part of that growth.

That change in immigration law is just one reason why the question 'And who is my neighbor?' is more complicated than ever. There is also a huge generation gap. This started in the 1960s but recently there is a widening gap between younger and older Americans. In some ways they live in different worlds.

Trying to keep a church growing takes on these huge complications and, on top of this, Americans have a very different view of religion today. Apart from looking for new church members, we are called to serve our neighbor. 'Who is my neighbor?' is a question for market research and data collection but it's also a mission that we are all charged with, a mission to love. We must love our neighbor, but how? We need to know who they are.

There is a FULL Congregation meeting on Sunday, May 5<sup>th</sup> regarding the sale of the Parsonage. We need all voting members to attend. We must have a quorum. Please do your best to attend. We have sold all assets in the Parsonage, we have removed all other debris, we have had it cleaned top to bottom and believe we are ready to go to sale. We need your approval to hire the Attorney. We have also selected the real estate agent. We will update you on all of the above on the 5<sup>th</sup>.

Thank you again to all that made this happen. The council members, of course, especially Brett, Denise, Traci and Donna. As well as Lydia Bersito, Leam McEvoy and Susanne Kuligowski. We couldn't have done it without you!

We have formed a subcommittee to explore all options in replacing our sexton, Sylvia, who is retiring in mid-June. We have decided to hire a part time sexton for 8-10 hours a week. One that doesn't live on property. See insert below about that position. We, as a council, have determined that it is better to leave the sexton apartment empty for the time being since we do not know what our future Pastor role will look like. This way we have it if we need it. We have also had an inquiry from the preschool about renting it. So, we have options.

Thank you to the rest of the council who have also been committing their time and talents to help preserve our church and its future. Every member is doing their part to ensure our future.

Currently we have Pastors confirmed for every single Sunday through the end of August. We will start recruiting Supply Pastors for the fall, as it seems we will not be in the position to Call a New Pastor before then. We are very fortunate to have our coverage Pastor, Jim O'Hanlon, who has agreed to extend his commitment to August 31<sup>st</sup>. He has also agreed to begin Confirmation classes. There will be a Student and Parent dinner on Wednesday, May 8<sup>th</sup> at 7pm. All eligible children are welcome, please email me if you will be attending.

We want to also thank our Deacons and Lay Leaders who continue to support us and ensure we have all we need for weekly worship services. Thank you, Deacon Nancy Sigler, Deacon Renee Taylor, Susanne Kuligowski and Kris Haymon for your commitment.

Thank you to Carla LaBarbera, our Church Secretary, for all her help always! We truly appreciate her and all her work.

We are moving forward, business as usual, to maintain our church and its ministry. We will continue to keep you abreast of all updates as we have them. This is your church; we are just honored to be your council.




