For Such a Time as This

In my talk after church a few weeks ago I talked about how we might start to think about the future. We need to understand the world around us, how to be listening and helping. I talked about how the pace of change is hard to keep up with and the breadth and depth of change is hard to comprehend. Part of this change is about technology, but another part is a change in values and social mores involving sexual orientation and gender, the nature of composition of families. These are a part of what is sometimes called the culture wars. Our society is becoming increasingly divided and hostile.

Following the many events surrounding the January Presidential Inauguration there was an unusual amount of attention to the sermon at the service of National Unity the day after the inauguration. The President and other observers took issue with some of what the Bishop said, remarks that she directed to the President. With that national media attention, something preachers and churches and Bishops are not used to, there was a flurry of opinions and statements and even proposed legislation against the Bishop. If you did not see the sermon, you can google Bishop Mariann Budde or you can make an appointment where we can let you view it. The following Sunday I shared a response from our Presiding Bishop, Elizabeth Eaton. There were a great many other responses from other Bishops and preachers each making different points.

It is unusual for churches like ours to have this kind of attention. We don't do dramatic things that make a big splash. We are among what is called the Mainline churches; these are older, established European churches. That label comes from an actual route in Philadelphia that had many of these churches which were larger and more prominent at the time.

The intersection of church and politics is complicated and hazardous. Last year I gave a presentation on Christian Nationalism describing this fusion of church and politics that has a horrible history. I can share this on request.

Our society is increasingly polarized, ever more divided and hostile. We need to recognize the causes of this, the things that drive this toxicity. If there is going to be a place where people can still come together across political and social differences, it will be our houses of worship.

We don't always get the attention of the world in this time of blazing media messaging, but I believe we are the antidote to the divisiveness and isolation of our time. To step into that role will involve risks of negative reaction but it is a role we are called to by our gospel, a role for which we are richly gifted by God's Holy Spirit.

God Bless you and your families.... Hope to see you all Sunday!








BOOK CLUB CORNER


St. Luke's Book Club meets monthly at Barnes & Noble in Scarsdale. Everyone is welcome to join us!


