ST. LUKE'S SUMMER NEWSLETTER

I'm writing this on Memorial Day; in a few weeks it will be the 4th of July. National holidays lead me to think about the relationship between faith and government. My understanding of the Lutheran tradition is that the government, at all levels, has a calling to provide good order for all people with fairness and wisdom. Our role, as citizens is to support that when it happens and work to correct it when it falls short. These are always important considerations, they seem especially important these days.

In the United States, we have an important belief in the separation of church and state. This means all religions have equal respect and equal opportunity to practice their faith and advocate accordingly. The government cannot show favor to one religion, there is no "official American religion".

I hope you learned these basic concepts in your high school civics class, or elsewhere. I'm writing this reminder because there are increasing challenges to this shared understanding in our current political turmoil. You may hear the term "Christian Nationalism" in news broadcasts or in my sermons. I would be happy to discuss this with you if you have questions, but briefly, Christian Nationalists believe, among other things, that the United States should be a "Christian nation", that Christianity should be the official religion and some religions should be banned. When they say the government should rule by "Christian" principles they don't mean feeding the hungry and housing the homeless. Simply put, Christian Nationalism is a political/cultural movement coopting Christian symbols and language.

On Memorial Day, we honor those who gave their lives in war in defense of the American tradition and government. We need to honor that sacrifice by continued vigilance to protect those values in our daily lives as well.

The collection will be in the Fellowship Hall on June 8th, during our end of year picnic. Please give what you can. Every bit helps!


