BUILD US UP, LORD PART TWO

In November we move closer to the end of the year, liturgically and on the calendar. We also continue our focus on **Stewardship**. During October, we featured **Financial Stewardship**, listing how much a church costs, with some major expenses in blurbs in the Sunday bulletins. We distributed pledge cards, asking you to return them with your intention of giving in 2026. We will gather and bless those during the Harvest Home and Hymn Sing celebration on Sunday, November 23.

Financial support is just one aspect of **Stewardship.** There are other ways to support our ministry and mission at St. Luke through the year. In non-profit organizations, there is a line item in the income report called "in kind donations". This can mean several things, most often it is a calculation of the value of volunteer hours served.

We often take that for granted in a church. We might not feel motivated to join in when things seem to be going OK. Someone might think, "Sunday worship happens, coffee hour goes on, I guess there is no need for more help."

I did a quick calculation (in my head) of how much we might report if we listed the value of "in kind" donations. I'd report somewhere between \$500,000 and \$800,000. This includes the work of the Church Council, the Altar Guild and the many committees. We can increase that number.

I want you to consider the ways in which you could make a "pledge" for 2026. There are so many opportunities. Everyone can **pray for St. Luke.** Brighten our worship by singing in the **choir.** Take a turn as a **lector** or **greeter.** Join in **cooking** for Hope Community Services. There is so many more opportunities. Talk to me and learn about the ways **you** can add to your overall **Stewardship.** This is what we mean when we pray with thanksgiving for our "time, talents and possessions".

MESSAGE FROM ANOTHER PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Sometimes churches decide to strongly endorse politicians, both on the left and the right. This gives the impression that all churches are aligned along political lines. This is unfortunate, but understandable. In particular, the present intensity of Christian faith expressed within the ruling party is almost syncretic, causing some confusion. It may be encouraging and grounding for you if I provide clarity about what our own church is about.

Creeds: We hold to the creeds. Read them.

Faith alone. There are no rituals that replace simple trust in God, so we like to pray.

Repentance alone. The acknowledgement of failure is important for an honest relationship with God. Grace alone. We don't place any weight on our conduct for meriting God's love, which is not conditioned. Cross alone. We mistrust the allure of power and wealth. The real heart of God, suffering love, is revealed on the cross.

Scripture alone-Word Alone. We don't worship the Bible, but the bible points us to Christ, who we do worship. The Bible is the source and norm for our very lives, but we don't find God's will only from individual verses. The different books of the Bible interpret each other. We read the Bible as a whole to extrapolate God's will in each context.

Worship. We have a tradition and a strength in worshipping with liturgy and singing.

Learning. We value education and science. We believe in moral and spiritual formation for all ages.

Politics. The Lutheran church has learned the hard way that cozying up to any political authority comprises the church.

Creation. We are responsible for stewarding God's earth.

Justice: We care about fairness and equity in society, which is a powerful biblical theme.

Women: Women are leaders.

Marriage: Marriage is good for society and I would like for it to be available to all couples who desire it. Immigration: We have a history of competence in refugee care and health care around the world. Doubt: We are honest about the experience of spiritual doubt.

At its best, the Lutheran church should stand WITH the world as it is, in its goodness and beauty and its confusion and cruelty. In these embattled times, we call to its "grieving and broken nature, to its misplaced meaning," as my new favorite songwriter says.

So, in conclusion, are you in the right church?

The cross makes peace with our past; and the resurrection recreates our future.


intention to create a book that was "a little bit like a David Lynch film." We noted elements of surrealism, dreamlike sequences, and a unique blend of horror, mystery and drama.


